

## Statement of Justification for Archaeological Historic Resources Impact Assessment

**Instructions for use:**

A completed version of the "Statement of Justification for Archaeological Historic Resources Impact Assessment" form is to be attached to the Archaeological Research Permit Application submitted using the Online Permitting and Clearance (OPaC) system. It is used to justify conducting an Historic Resources Impact Assessment when there are no obvious triggers or to provide additional information for complex projects. Evaluations and recommendations should be provided by the permit applicant.

<p><b>Project Name or Project Identifier</b></p> <p>1. Full official name of the proposed development (project identifier). This name should be the one used by the proponent and other regulators. This name must be used consistently throughout the justification document and any subsequent correspondence and/or studies.</p>
